EVELYN JOHNSON SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Evelyn Johnson Scholarship Program (EJSP) recognizes the academic achievement of, and provides financial assistance to, the dependents of NASA Kennedy Space Center (KSC) civil service and NASA KSC Exchange employees. The scholarship honors the dedication and commitment of the late Evelyn Johnson, a Deputy Director, Equal Opportunity Program Office at KSC.

Applicants are evaluated on the basis of academic achievement, involvement in school and community activities, and education and career goals. The scholarship winners may pursue any course of study leading to an undergraduate degree at any accredited college in the country. The scholarship is intended to be used only for tuition, fees, books and supplies associated with attending college.

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT

Two to five, one-time only scholarships in varying amounts ranging from \$1000 up to \$2500 each.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- The EJSP is open to students in their senior (or equivalent) year of public, parochial, private high school or home schooling program and graduating in 2022.
- Applicants must have a minimum high school grade point average of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale, or the equivalent.
- Applicants must be dependents of current NASA KSC civil service or Exchange employees (i.e., NASA Sponsor) at the time of application.
- For purposes of this program, the minor dependent of a civil service or Exchange employee is defined as a child whom the employee claims on his or her Federal income tax return or who is a natural, adopted or foster child for which the employee furnishes the majority of support.

HOW TO APPLY

To be considered for the 2022 scholarship program, the following **must be received no later than April 15, 2022**:

- Completed application form
- Current school transcript
- A copy of their Scholastic Achievement Test (SAT) or the American College Test (ACT) score report, or another recognized test designed to measure ability and aptitude for higher education. Scores on the school transcript will not be used in place of an SAT or ACT score report

All applications and supporting documents must be delivered in a **sealed envelope** or **sent via encrypted email** to the addressed below:

SELECTION OF WINNERS

Application forms and scholastic records are evaluated by the KSC NASA Exchange Scholarship Committee based on the following criteria:

- Academic record, including all high school and college (if taken) grades and nature of courses
- Performance on recognized tests designed to measure ability and aptitude for higher education, for example: Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) or American College Test (ACT)
- School honors and recognitions
- Extra-curricular activities (including school and community)
- Demonstrated leadership and accomplishments
- An essay explaining your motivations for attending college and how you plan to use your degree after graduation

Both selectees and non-selectees will be notified June 2022.

PRIVACY ACT STATEMENT

51 U.S.C. § 20113(c)(5) and NASA Procedural Directive 9050.6 authorize the NASA Exchange to collect applicant and employee information necessary to award the Evelyn Johnson Scholarship. This information will be disclosed to the scholarship committee and NASA Exchange management for the purposes of making scholarship award decisions. This information may also be disclosed to academic institutions attended by applicants for the purposes of obtaining or verifying applicant information.

Aggregated data based on application materials may be used in management reports designed to evaluate the scholarship program as a whole and for reporting within NASA. The names and limited biographical information (e.g., age, school, intended major, and grade point average) of scholarship winners may be published by NASA or the NASA Exchange.

Submission of the information requested on the application is voluntary. Omission of any particular item not necessary to establish eligibility will not preclude consideration of the applicant for the scholarship. However, failure to provide full and complete information may reduce the possibility of receiving an award.
